

**Tiger Pathway “Tigers in the Wild”**

This pathway takes about 2 – 3 hours to complete (depending on the size and attention of your group). The activities are fun and engaging for kids and adults. These activities lean toward some of the STEM activities, and provide opportunity to unleash a child’s natural curiosity. Great for a group of 4 – 8 people.

Place to visit	Activity	Tiger Adventure Requirement
On your own	With your partner, name and collect the Cub Scout Six Essentials you need for a hike. Tell your den leader what you would need to add to your list to prepare for rain.	Req. 1
Outside	Go for a short hike with your den or family, and carry your own gear. Show you know how to get ready for this hike.	Req. 2
Ecology	Listen while your leader reads the Outdoor Code. Talk about how you can be clean in your outdoor manners.	Req. 3a
Model Campsite/ Scoutcraft area	Listen while your leader reads the Leave No Trace Principles for Kids. Discuss why you should “Trash Your Trash”.	Req. 3b
General	Apply the Outdoor Code and Leave No Trace Principles for Kids on your Tiger den and pack outings. After one outing, share what you did to demonstrate the principles you discussed.	Req. 3c
Outside	While on your hike, find 3 different kinds of plants, animals, or signs that animals have been on the trail. List what you saw in your Tiger handbook.	Req. 4
Outside	Find 2 different trees and 2 different types of plants that grow in your area. Write their names in your Tiger handbook.	Req. 6
Outside	Visit an outside place with your den or family. Learn more about 2 animals, and write down 2 interesting things about them in your Tiger handbook.	Req. 7
