

Pathway: _____ Scouting Heritage _____

This pathway takes about 3 to 5 hours to complete (depending on the size and attention of your group). The activities are educational and engaging for kids and adults. These activities lean toward the history of scouting, as well as it pertains to the local area. It provides an opportunity to unleash a person’s historical knowledge and retention. Great for a group of 4 – 8 people.

Around Camp	Reproduce the equipment for an old-time Scouting game such as those played at Brownsea Island. You may find one on your own (with your counselor’s approval), or pick one from the Scouting Heritage merit badge pamphlet. Teach and play the game with other Scouts.		Scouting Heritage MB Req. 7
The Egan Center	Participate in the Scouting Heritage quiz walk. This walk brings you through the Egan center and to Hayden lodge, covering the history of this camp, as well as the history of scouting! *paperwork at front desk.		Scouting Heritage MB Req. 2a, b
Around Camp	Interview at least three people (different from those you interviewed for requirement 5) over the age of 40 who were Scouts. Find out about their Scouting experiences. Ask about the impact that Scouting has had on their lives. Share what you learned with your counselor.		Scouting Heritage MB Req. 8
Around Camp / Egan Center	Learn about the history of your unit or Scouting in your area. Interview at least two people (one from the past and one from the present) associated with your troop. Create a report of your findings on the history of your troop, and present it to your patrol or troop.		Scouting Heritage MB Req. 5
	The Egan Center is also an exhibit of Scouting memorabilia. Learn what you can about the history of Boy Scouting. Give a short report to your counselor on what you saw and learned.		Scouting Heritage MB Req. 4c
	Discuss with your counselor how Scouting’s programs have developed over time and been adapted to fit different age groups and interests (Cub Scouting, Sea Scouts, Exploring, Venturing, Scouts).		Scouting Heritage MB Req. 3
EGAN Center	Discuss with your group and a staff member the life and times of Lord Baden-Powell of Gilwell. Explain why he felt a program like Scouting would be good for the young people of his day.
