

Trail LGBTQ

This trail takes about 2 – 3 hours to complete (depending on the size and attention of your group). The activities are fun and engaging for kids and adults. These activities lean toward some of the Interpersonal activities, and provide opportunity to create conversation about gender identity, orientation, and LGBTQ community. Great for a family or group looking to support and create conversation with members who may have recently come out, or run into bullying or other issues related to LGBTQ societal concerns.

STEM (indoor / outdoor)	Observe and describe the parenting roles of fish, reptiles, birds, and mammals found in the blue hills		
Rifle Range	After learning the safety and skills of how to shoot, compare your results with friends of different ages and genders. Look for improvements in accuracy. Who had the best shot? Who had the most improved accuracy? Does gender play a role in accuracy? Throughout history, why do you think most soldiers are male?		
Native American	Make a basket or moccasins. Discuss the gender roles of native Americans		
Discussion Circle	What makes a good parent		
Discussion Circle	List several reasons why you are important to your family.		
Pool	Conduct a swimming race with your friends, using various strokes. What seems to be the physical attributes that make some folks better swimmers than others? Length of arms and legs? Drag? Weight? Body shape? Strength?
